The 2024 Paris Olympic Games have marked a watershed moment for China as the nation achieved a series of historic milestones across a wide range of sports. These achievements not only underscore China's growing competitiveness on the global stage but also signal a powerful legacy for future generations of Chinese athletes.

In traditional strongholds like diving and table



tennis, Chinese athletes delivered an unprecedented performance, sweeping eight and five gold medals respectively across all categories. This rare

feat at a single Olympics highlights the country's continued dominance in these sports, where precision and consistency are key.

The Chinese swimming team also made history, wrapping up their campaign in Paris with a record-breaking 12 medals - two golds, three silvers, and seven bronzes. This marks the highest number of medals ever secured by the Chinese swim team in Olympic history, signalling a significant leap forward in a sport where China has been striving to make its mark.

One of the most noteworthy achievements came in tennis, where 21-year-old Zheng Qinwen became the first Asia-born player to win a gold medal in the Olympic singles event. Her victory is particularly remarkable as it breaks the traditional dominance of Western players in tennis, showcasing China's rising talent in a sport that has been relatively new to the country's roster of strengths.

China's overall performance in Paris was bolstered by its traditionally strong sports, with a staggering 27 gold medals coming from diving, table tennis, badminton, gymnastics, shooting, and weightlifting. The Chinese delegation concluded the Games with 40 gold medals and a total of 91, surpassing their previous record set at the London 2012 Olympics. This remarkable achievement marks the best gold medal tally for China in any overseas edition of

the Summer Olympics, underscoring the nation's growing prowess on the international stage.

These achievements are significant for several reasons. Firstly, they highlight China's expanding influence in global sports beyond its traditional强holds. The success of younger athletes in diverse disciplines such as swimming and tennis reflects the country's strategic investment in broadening its athletic capabilities. It also signifies a new era of Chinese sportsmanship, where the nation is not just a powerhouse in a few selected sports but a formidable competitor across a broader spectrum.

For India, these developments are a reminder of the importance of nurturing young talent and investing in a wide range of sports to achieve sustained success on the global stage.

As China continues to build on its legacy, India's sports ecosystem could draw valuable lessons from its neighbor's approach to athlete development, infrastructure investment, and international competitiveness.

Odisha's pivotal role in Indian hockey's resurgence

The Indian hockey team put up against odds and went on with commitment and conviction to claim back-to-back Olympic Hockeys bronze medal. It was shocking when ace India defender Amit Rohidas was shown red card in the Olympic quarter-final match against Great Britain.

Rohidas, an important cobweb in defence and feeding forwards in their surge towards opponent's goalmouth was sadly missed in the semifinal against Germany.

However, in the play-off against Spain for the Bronze medal, skipper Harmanpreet, Srijesh and Amit are to be lauded for their resilience and grit to overcome a mounting challenge from Spain in the closing stages of the game.

In India's journey to salvage respect in hockey at international level, the role of coach Craig Fulton proved fruitful. Fulton oversaw some massive changes which have reflected in their result.

After the Indian hockey team's remarkable performance at Paris, capturing second consecutive Olympic bronze medal ushered the return of glory days for the sport in the country.

Kudos to Odisha in becoming the home of Indian hockey, an epithet



earlier earned by Punjab.

It was holistic development of Indian hockey under the wings of Odisha govt where a total package for the development of hockey was developed, including sponsorship of the game.

It is commendable that the state has developed international standard infrastructure to back hockey as a national game. Odisha has successfully organized FIH Men's Hockey World Cup tournament in indigenously built largest hockey stadium at Rourkela in 2018 and 2023. Para badminton star Bhagat suspended for doping violations

Bengaluru, Aug 15:

In a major blow to India's Paralympic ambitions, Pramod Bhagat, the Paralympic badminton champion, who clinched gold at the Tokyo 2020 Games, has been handed an 18-month suspension by the Badminton World Federation (BWF).

This ruling means Bhagat will miss the Paris 2024 Paralympic Games.

With two consecutive series victories on Australian soil, the team is on the brink of something historic - securing three back-to-back Test series wins against Australia in their own backyard.

Ravi Shastri, a former coach and a stalwart of Indian cricket, firmly believes that his former team can continue their recent dominance. The anticipation surrounding the series is palpable, with Australia still smarting from their last two defeats and hungry for revenge. Shastri knows that the Australians, led by Pat Cummins, will be formidable opponents, but he is confident in India's ability to rise to the occasion.

Australia, having last claimed the Border-Gavaskar Trophy with a 2-0 win on home soil in 2015, is eager to regain their grip on the coveted prize. The upcoming five-match series, set to begin in November, is already being billed as one of the most eagerly awaited contests in recent memory.

Australian legend Ricky Ponting has predicted a 3-1 victory for his side, but Shastri is quick to remind everyone of India's resilience and determination.
